The Red House

The Red House has witnessed and undergone many changes in its century-plus history. Once a favorite movie house among the gay community, it is today a trendy hub for cultural and artistic creativities during the daytime. After nightfall, the open-air bars on its South Square are always abuzz with laughter. This open space attests how the LGBT+ community can confidently step out of the shadows and enjoy themselves.

Rainbow Six

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On May 17, 2019, Taiwan became the first country in Asia to legalize same-sex marriage. To commemorate this milestone, the Taipei City Government installed a land art work titled *Rainbow Six* at Exit 6 of MRT Ximen Station. This is now not only a top check-in spot on social media, but also a fitting declaration of Taipei's message of pride to the world.

Ketagalan Boulevard

Ketagalan Boulevard, in front of the Presidential Office Building, is a major site for marches where people voice their demands to promote the country's progress. This venue has also served as the starting and end point for Taiwan LGBT+ Pride multiple times, a witness to how gender and marriage equality have sprouted in Taipei.

228 Peace Park

228 Peace Park used to be an important rendezvous point for gay men. Many suffered unlawful detention amid a massive police raid on nearby Changde Street. leaving behind an indelible mark of sorrow. With the rise of awareness, the Taipei City Government transformed the somber park entrance into "The Rainbow Gate," a symbol of coming to terms with the bitter past of the LGBT+ community.

Somebody Café

The illustrator/shop owner has created an elegant interior adorned with artworks and greenery. Mudan

Enjoy the best view of The Red House here, with red lanterns suspended from the trees, rainbow flags proudly flying, and the flickering lights creating a romantic yet nostalgic atmosphere. In keeping with the Taiwanese tradition of "tea offerings under trees," Mudan has created a friendly dining space that allows everyone to bask in a relaxing evening.

G2 Paradise



Vibrant and colorful, G2 Paradise is undoubtedly an establishment with an impeccable ambiance, offering up to 88 flair bartending concoctions, ensuring a delightful surprise each time even after a series of rounds. It is no surprise LGBT+ individuals from around the world have thronged the place, creating a mini United Nations.

Café Dalida





Distinctly reminiscent of a tropical forest, this café is decorated with lush greenery, potted palms, and hanging foliage. The soothing ambiance of the place attracts domestic and foreign visitors alike, while drag queen performances on weekend nights bring the house down with their dazzling glamour.

Locker Room



The décor here is patterned after a gym: in addition to locker and shower rooms, the seating area is adorned with white tiles and frosted glass. There is even a showerhead over the dance floor for muscular men to give passionate macho wet shows. You can volunteer for a close encounter with the entertainers amidst the water drenching.






Neighborhoods of Cultural Fragrance

Established in 1999, this was the first LGBT-themed bookstore with multiple services in the Chinese-speaking world. Consisting of six "sun" characters, its Chinese name is intended to convey the message of the six-colored rainbow of LGBT+ pride. As a coorganizer of the "Rainbow Community in Gongguan" project, it teamed up with neighboring businesses to promote a friendly dialogue between the LGBT+ and general communities.

Rainbow Starting Line

Stretched out on Taipei City Hall Square, the *Rainbow Starting Line* is the city's second work of rainbow land art, following *Rainbow Six.* The six-color spectrum signifies the pride and passion of the LGBT+community as well as the city's unwavering commitment to gender equality as Asia's frontrunner in promoting friendliness.

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Bacio Taipei



In contrast with the hustle and bustle common to other gay bars, Bacio conspicuously provides a comfortable and relaxing ambiance with its spacious setting. Bacio offers only drinks and not meals, keeping the place refreshingly tranquil. The old movies projected on the walls seem to slow down the passage of time as you accompanied by the easygoing music.





With its name taken from Zeus' only male lover in Greek mythology, this club was founded by the YouTuber duo FJ234, who enjoy great fame across the Chinese-speaking LGBT+ community. There's a good chance of spotting celebrities here. Its drag gueen shows never fail to enchant and delight the audience, with the performers dancing to classic tunes from different eras.

L bar

With the absence of any business sign, a sense of mystery emanates from the bar's orange-red exterior. L bar is a casual space gently enveloped in a seablue hue, in which patrons can easily clear their minds. Belle's features a round counter under a carousel-like canopy, surrounded by vibrant graffiti murals, as is fitting for a magical place that comes alive only in the depths of the night. Goldfish



This day is to advocate for an end to discrimination against the LGBT+ community. As the first Asian city to join the Rainbow Cities Network, Taipei has raised the rainbow flag on May 17 every year since 2020, while rallying all sister cities and foreign missions in Taiwan to join the cause.

The Stonewall Uprising in New York in June 1969 was a tipping point for gay rights movement and has later evolved into an annual celebration worldwide in the form of various gender equality initiatives. International leading brands and friendly businesses in Taipei actively show solidarity.



Taiwan LGBT+ Pride is held on the last Saturday of every October. This largest gay pride parade in East Asia has had different advocacy themes over the years, from ending discrimination to calling for equality, with a view to uniting collective efforts and driving progress.




