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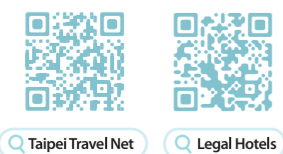

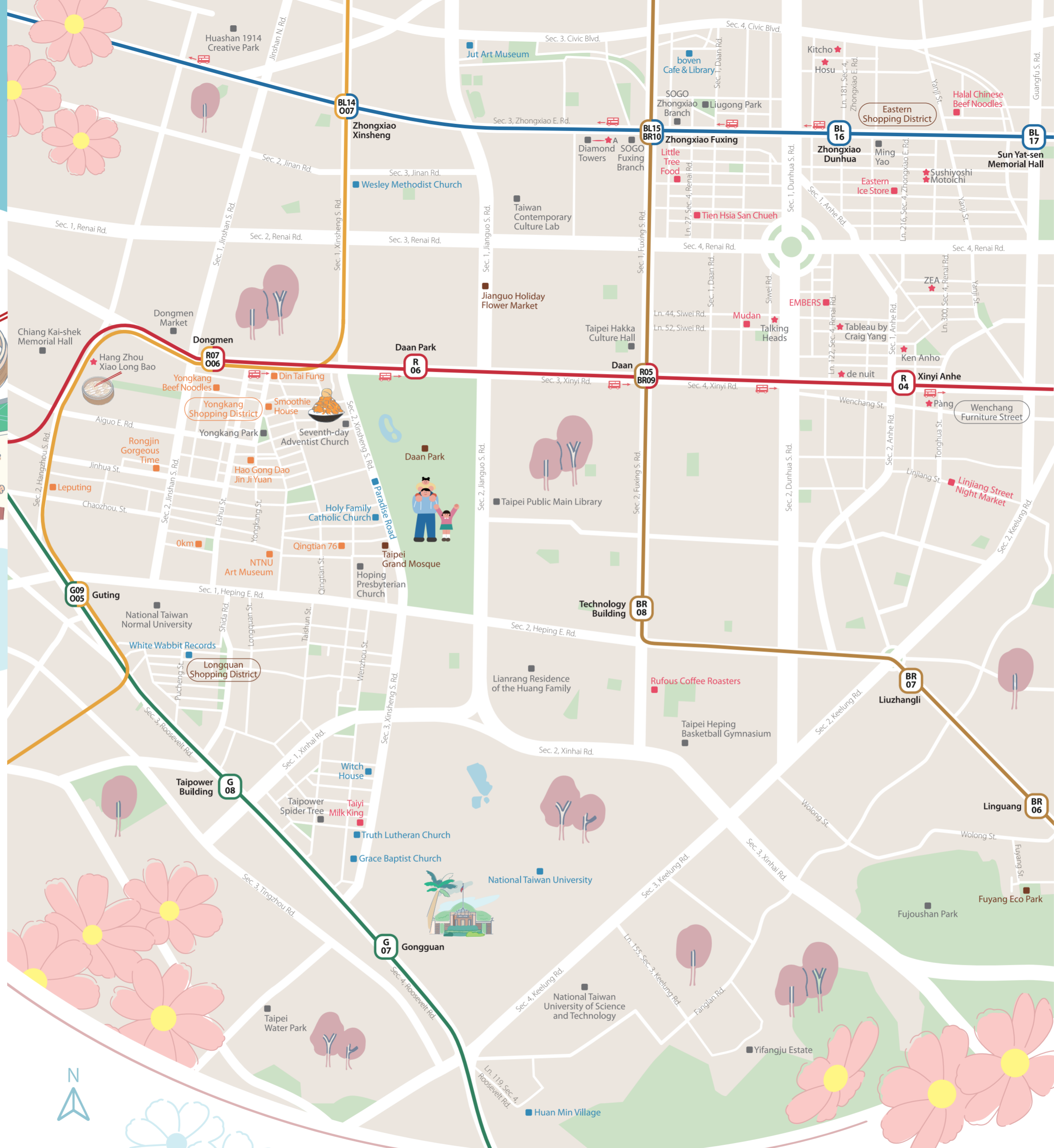

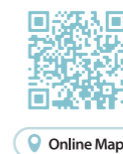

Exciting Events

Taipei Azalea Festival

March Daan Park

During the azalea season, the park transforms into a prime flower-viewing destination. Visitors can enjoy art installations, music performances, and fun DIY courses, offered in partnership with businesses around the South Town area.



Taipei Floral Picnic

Late March Daan Park

This annual event allows friends and families to enjoy picnics amid blooming flowers. The music performances, themed activities, and creative markets make it a perfect choice for family outings, and even some pet-friendly fun.



Eid al-Fitr in Taipei

Each year after Ramadan Daan Park

Held after Ramadan each year, this event features stage shows, halal markets, and Muslim cultural experiences, such as henna painting, Arabic alphabets calligraphy, and Gamelan percussion.



Fun in Taipei East Party

Sec. 1, Daan Rd. (next to Liugong Park)

A vibrant mix of market stalls, food trucks, and music performances, this event partners with the surrounding shopping district to offer a variety of promotions. It's an exciting event made for hypebeasts.



Taipei Christmas Infinite Love

December
Daan Park; Sec. 1-3, Xinsheng S. Rd.

Each year, Xinsheng South Road, known as the "Paradise Road," is decorated with Christmas lighting and features music performances. It's a great place to experience Taipei's festive atmosphere.



Highlight

Around MRT Dongmen Station

Yongkang Shopping District

Area bounded by Sec. 2 Xinyi Rd., Sec. 2 Xinsheng S. Rd., Sec. 1 Heping E. Rd., and Sec. 2 Jinshan S. Rd.

With Yongkang Park at its heart, this district is a favorite for foreign visitors. It's packed with renowned shops serving *xiaolongbao*, mango shaved ice, and beef noodles, alongside teahouses, handicraft and gift stores.



Rongjin Gorgeous Time

167, Jinhua St. (02) 2321-8896

Once Japanese-era officer quarters, this site is now a vibrant lifestyle park. You'll find restaurants, cafés, teahouses, and even *kimono* experience shops. There are bustling weekend markets as well.



Leputing

67, Sec. 2, Hangzhou S. Rd. (02) 2395-1689

This creative cuisine restaurant, located in a century-old Japanese building, offers a seasonal menu of fresh ingredients and exquisite presentations. Diners can also appreciate the art pieces displayed in its quaint garden and corridors.



Food

Little Tree Food

17, Ln. 116, Sec. 1, Daan Rd. (02) 2778-2277

This Michelin Green Star establishment champions fresh ingredients and vibrant plating. Among its diverse menu, the Avocado Macro Bowl and the Sichuan Spicy Dumplings are the most raved.



Tien Hsia San Chueh

3, Ln. 27, Sec. 4, Renai Rd. (02) 2741-6299

Praised by the Bib Gourmand, the noodle soup offers a luxurious experience with oxtail, beef tendon, boneless short rib, and beef shank heart – all in one bowl. The tomato broth has even been dubbed the "Rolls-Royce of beef noodles."



Mudan

17, Ln. 52, Siwei Rd. (02) 2706-8699

This Japanese tempura restaurant has been awarded a two-Michelin-star rating for consecutive years. The chef coats seasonal seafood and vegetables in a paper-thin batter, deep-frying them to perfection to bring out the most delicious flavor of the finest ingredients.

21, Ln. 203, Sec. 2, Jinshan S. Rd. (02) 7755-7526

Housed within century-old Japanese wooden buildings, this estate features a Taiwan mountain forest theme. It partners with more than a hundred brands to offer a curated selection of *yama*-style products.



NTNU Art Museum

129, Sec. 1, Heping E. Rd. (NTNU Heping Campus II) (02) 7749-7791

This asymmetrical structure clad in titanium steel walls houses NTNU's art collections spanning over a century. Visitors can observe art restoration and explore immersive exhibitions created by faculty and students.



Qingtian 76

6, Ln. 7, Qingtian St. (02) 2391-6676

Once a professor's residence from Japanese era, this storied old house now provides free guided tours. It also serves as a versatile space, offering refined dining options and cultural-creative products.



Din Tai Fung (Xinyi Branch)

194, Sec. 2, Xinyi Rd. (02) 2321-8928

This Taiwanese restaurant brand, acclaimed internationally, specializes in refined Chinese cuisine. Their top three recommendations are the signature 18-fold *xiaolongbao*, spicy shrimp and pork wontons, and pork chop fried rice.



Xinyi branch is takeout only; dine-in is available at the nearby Xinsheng branch.

Yongkang Beef Noodles

17, Ln. 31, Sec. 2, Jinshan S. Rd. (02) 2351-1051

The long-established beef noodle restaurant offers rich, savory broth and tender, chewy beef. Their must-try side is steamed pork ribs over broth-soaked sweet potato.



Smoothie House

15, Yongkang St. 0908-059-121

The CNN-recommended spot serves Taiwan's must-try mango shaved ice: fresh mango chunks atop fluffy snow ice, finished with a generous scoop of ice cream for intense sweetness. You can also enjoy classic flavors like lychee, peanut, and longan.

Hao Gong Dao Jin Ji Yuan

28-1, Yongkang St. (02) 2341-6980

This Shanghai dim sum restaurant has been operating for over 50 years and was a longtime Bib Gourmand winner. It serves dozens of small dishes, including steamed dumplings, fried tofu with glass noodles, and sweet-savory sponge cake.



Linjiang Street Night Market

Linjiang St. (between Tonghua St. and Keelung Rd.)

This street, just under a kilometer long, is home to several Michelin-recommended snacks like braised dishes, fried chicken, and stinky tofu, as well as a fruit stall beloved by NVIDIA CEO Jensen Huang, and fried sweet potato balls raved by K-pop idols.



Rufous Coffee Roasters

339, Sec. 2, Fuxing S. Rd. (02) 2736-6880

As the only coffee shop from Taiwan selected for the inaugural "The World's 100 Best Coffee Shops," this place offers a diverse range of coffee options, from pour-over and espresso to cold brew and siphon. The delicate flavors truly lives up to its reputation.



Taiyi Milk King

82, Sec. 3, Xinsheng S. Rd. (02) 2363-4341

This long-standing ice shop offers milk, lemon, and grass jelly ice. Their "Eight Treasures Milk Ice," with eight toppings including adzuki beans, candied taro, and chewy pearls, is highly recommended.



Tourist Spots

Eastern Shopping District

Area bounded by Civic Blvd., Guangfu S. Rd., Fuxing S. Rd., and Renai Rd.

Home to several department stores surrounded by numerous brand flagship stores, clothing boutiques, restaurants, and creative markets, this district also has all kinds of bars and 24/7 karaoke spots that deliver the most vibrant nightlife in Taipei.



Longquan Shopping District

Area bounded by Shida Rd., Longquan St., Yunhe St., and Ln. 39 Shida Rd.

Also known as Shida Night Market, this area is a popular dining spot for NTNU students. It features must-try places like Longquan Fish Soup, Lantern Soy Sauce Braised Food, and Hohomei (pineapple bun with butter), along with coffee shops and boutiques.



Jianguo Holiday Flower Market

Under Jianguo Elevated Road (between Renai Rd. and Xinyi Rd.)

A parking lot on weekdays transforms into this bustling flower market on weekends. Hundreds of vendors offer diverse gardening supplies and fresh flowers, making it the best choice to satisfy all floral and gardening needs.



Daan Park

1, Sec. 2, Xinsheng S. Rd.

Described as the "lungs of the city," this park has diverse plants, including the iconic azaleas, plus an artificial lake with a waterfowl eco island. Over recent years, conservation efforts have successfully reintroduced a firefly population.



Taipei Grand Mosque

62, Sec. 2, Xinsheng S. Rd. (02) 2321-9445

This mosque showcases Arabian architecture with iconic domes, arcades, and minarets. Inside, admire the 15-meter-high ceiling, mosaic decorations, and stained glass art. It hosts daily prayers, weekend activities, and is open to the public.



Fuyang Eco Park

Ln. 272, Wolong St. and end of Fuyang St.

Once a restricted military zone, this area preserves its natural ecology, including masked palm civets and crested serpent eagles. The themed sections like the Wetland Area are perfect for observing rare inhabitants like the Taipei tree frog.



Culture

National Taiwan University

1, Sec. 4, Roosevelt Rd. (02) 3366-3366

The main gate of this university retains its Japanese-era look. Visitors can cycle along the azalea-lined Royal Palm Boulevard or relax by the Drunken Moon Lake to experience the scholarly vibe of Taiwan's top institution.



Huan Min Village (The Toad Hill)

12, Aly. 66, Ln. 119, Sec. 4, Roosevelt Rd. (02) 2377-7300 ext. 10

This is Taipei City's sole fully preserved air force dependents' village. Inhabited to this day, it serves as a living cultural asset that constantly hosts lectures and exhibitions.



Paradise Road

Sec. 1-3, Xinsheng S. Rd.

Xinsheng South Road is known as the "Paradise Road" for its many religious buildings, including Wesley Methodist Church, Holy Family Catholic Church, Taipei Grand Mosque, Truth Lutheran Church, and Grace Baptist Church.



Jut Art Museum

178, Sec. 3, Civic Blvd. (02) 8772-6178

Established in 2016, this is Taiwan's first art museum dedicated to contemporary art and architecture exhibitions, with a focus on themes of "the future" and "the city."



boven Cafe & Library

B1, 18, Aly. 5, Ln. 107, Sec. 1, Fuxing S. Rd. (02) 2778-7526

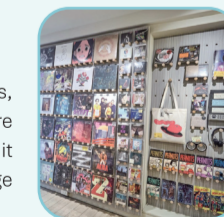
Taiwan's first magazine-themed library, this place has tens of thousands of magazines on architecture, design, fashion, lifestyle, etc. A café on the first floor serves food and drinks.



White Rabbit Records

1-1, Ln. 21, Pucheng St. (02) 2369-7915

This store, filled with CDs, vinyl records, cassettes, and rare albums, is a true treasure trove for music lovers. The owner aims for it to be a precious "last record store" in an age dominated by digital streaming.



Witch House

7, Ln. 56, Sec. 3, Xinsheng S. Rd. (02) 2362-5494

This café, where numerous famous singers performed pre-fame, is a shared memory for countless music lovers. On the weekend, you can play board games or enjoy small music shows, each one nurturing future music stars.
