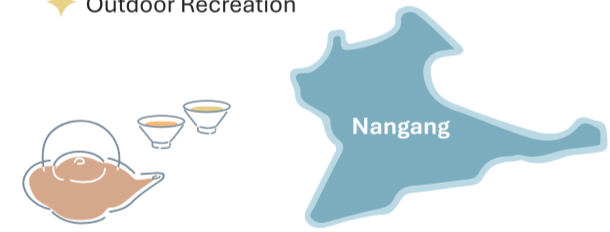

Firefly Season

- ▶ April-May
- ▶ Nangang Tea Processing Demonstration Center

From late spring to early summer, the ecologically rich Jiuzhuang tea hills are an excellent place to witness this natural wonder. The sparkling fireflies can be seen while visitors enjoy beautiful sunsets and tea fragrance.

Nature

Mt. Muzhi

▶ Trailhead: 245, Sec. 3, Academia Rd.

Mt. Muzhi's distinct slopes, gentle to the east and steep to the west with a summit rock, offer two hiking options: the Nangangshan Hiking Trail and the Shumei Historic Trail.



Nangangshan Hiking Trail

▶ Trailhead: 245, Sec. 3, Academia Rd.

Mt. Nangang's well-connected trail system offers routes for every hiker. The paths feature smooth stone steps, and reaching the top rewards you with stunning views of the Greater Taipei area.



Li Shan Farmer's Square

The Japanese-era academy now offers a soothing retreat with bald cypress trees and the artfully arranged landscape. Across the street, Sifen Stream has charming heart-shaped stepping stones and a riverside walkway.



Food

Taipei Music Center Dining & Bar Area

▶ Taipei Music Center

The Taipei Music Center has a dynamic collection of dining options, including Kafka by TMC (music and beer), W9T (wine and craft beer retailer), Chotto Sake Bar, and Hold on Draft (cocktails). The occasional live music performances showcase the center's distinctive atmosphere.

Ke Lao Ell

Committed to sourcing solely natural ingredients, this pastry shop offers more than just classic pineapple cakes and "wife cakes." Their crispy and fragrant egg tarts are also a major draw.

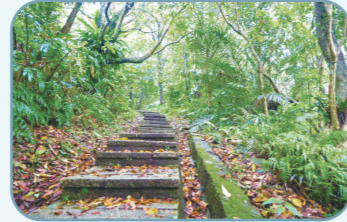
Located within the Taipei Music Center, this tea house features selections like Alishan black tea and Sun Link Sea oolong tea, alongside packaged tea leaves and teaware items.



Gengliao Historic Trail

▶ Trailhead: Entrance of Ln. 122, Sec. 2, Jiuzhuang St.

This well-preserved century-old trail features granite steps while retaining some original gravel sections. Points of interest along the way include the Tukupue mountain and the Pan Ancestral Residence.



Shanshuilu Eco Park

▶ 37, Nanshen Rd.

This parkland, a successful transformation of an old landfill, now acts as an ideal spot for cycling, kite flying, and enjoying outdoor picnics with its vast grassland and eco-friendly facilities.



Guihua Suspension Bridge Trail

▶ 334, Sec. 2, Jiuzhuang St.

One notable feature of this easy-walking trail must be the Guihua Suspension Bridge, designed with a teapot motif. In full bloom, the surrounding sweet osmanthus and ginger lilies fill the air with their lovely scent and timeless grace.



Guihualin Trail

▶ Next to 336, Sec. 2, Jiuzhuang St.

As the most iconic section of the Guihua trails, this area showcases an osmanthus grove over fifty years old. Interspersed along are also pomelo and tea trees, creating a wonderfully fragrant atmosphere.



Chengmei Left Bank Riverside Park

▶ Left bank of Keelung River (between Chenggong Bridge and MacArthur No. 1 Bridge)

With sports facilities like basketball courts, a skating rink, and chin-up bars, this area also delights visitors through the seasonally planted flower fields and the colorful Rainbow Bridge in the distance.



Hsin Hsin Park

▶ 26, Ln. 47, Sec. 3, Nangang Rd.

This ecological park offers a diverse array of natural environments, including a wetland garden, emergent plant life, and bald cypress trees. It also provides recreational facilities for children.

Tourist Spots

Taipei Nangang Exhibition Center

▶ 1 & 2, Jingmao 2nd Rd. (Hall 1 and Hall 2) ▶ (02) 2725-5200

This is a vast multi-purpose exhibition and convention center with a high ceiling and no pillars, suitable for hosting large-scale concerts, incentive gatherings, conferences, exhibitions, and other events.



LaLaport Taipei Nangang

This shopping park is conveniently located near the MRT Taipei Nangang Exhibition Center Station. It offers a wide selection of shops, restaurants, a cinema, bookstores, and family-friendly facilities, all designed to create a refreshing "urban oasis."



Area around Nangang Station

▶ Area bounded by Sec. 8 Civic Blvd., Xingzhong Rd., and Sec. 7 Zhongxiao E. Rd.

Nangang's transportation hub is conveniently located near the Global Mall and CITYLINK, offering everything you need. This area is also home to the 25-screen Century Asia Theater and the spacious Tsutaya Bookstore, making it a great area to unwind.



Nangang Park

▶ 170-1, Dongxin St.

At the entrance of this park is a classic Chinese archway. The park is a haven for plants and birds, and it has varied sports fields and play areas. There is even an area where you can go fishing.



Taipei Nan Gang Sports Center

Equipped with a diving pool, this center allows certified divers to refine their skills. Professional venues and instructors are also available in shooting, archery, and martial arts.



Nangang Tea Processing Demonstration Center

This building functions as a center for tea education and tasting. It exhibits tea production machinery and hosts all kinds of tea-related events, including guided tours and tea-making experience activities.



Culture

Taipei Music Center

This pop music-themed park features a Concert Hall, a Cultural Cube, a Creative Hub, and an Outdoor Plaza. The center regularly hosts art and music performances, markets, and various events, standing as a trendy hub in Taipei's east.



POPOP Taipei

Once a factory, this space has been re-imagined as an experimental ground, frequently hosting exhibitions, creative markets, and startup seminars. Its Japanese architectural heritage, evident in the cypress roof and high ceilings, attracts many fans of vintage buildings.



Jing Hsin Yuan

This century-old former sanatorium now serves as a restorative art and cultural space, offering gourmet food and quiet reading corners. With its art therapy courses, it is an ideal place to find tranquility.



Museum of the Institute of History and Philology

A research-oriented museum connected to the Academia Sinica, this institution exhibits research manuscripts, historical equipment, and maintains the original condition of unearthed artifacts, revealing their historical background and value.



Shin Yeh Shiao Ju ★

This creative restaurant offers an artful blend of innovative dishes and various traditional fare. The signature Stir-fried Green Chili with Preserved Egg and Minced Pork, a Bib Gourmand selection, complements the rice perfectly with its crisp, savory taste.



TUMAZ

The owner's dedication to quality shines through in the Geisha coffee, brewed from hand-picked beans originating in Africa and Central/South America before meticulously roasted for a rich floral, fruity aroma and delicate, lingering acidity.



Zhen Hao Potsticker

This long-established potsticker shop is famous for its freshly made and perfectly pan-fried dumplings. Expect a golden, crispy crust giving way to a juicy filling, paired best with its hot and sour soup.



Lao Zhang Shaobing

The on-site charcoal-grilled shaobing (sesame flatbread) features a remarkably crispy crust and a flavorful, pepper-rich filling with a strong charcoal aroma. Its popularity ensures it's frequently sold out fresh from the oven.
