Exciting Events

Treasure Hill Light Festival

- March-May
- Treasure Hill Artist Village

With different themes each year, artists are invited to co-create and incorporate installations, images, and sounds, resulting in interactive artworks that give the public a unique visual spectacle.



Taipei Water Festival

- July-August
- Taipei Water Park

One of Taipei's summer highlights and a great place for family fun, this festival features water play facilities, a park fair, interactive games, food trucks, and a market.



Chill Out Festival

- Around late September-mid October
- Gongguan Riverside Plaza

This significant music festival, with multiple stages and a laid-back vibe, brings together a diverse lineup of hip-hop, indie bands, R&B, and DJs from Taiwan and abroad.



Taipei Hakka Yimin Festival

- October
- NTCH Art and Culture Concourse

This is a Hakka culture carnival, with events such as processions to welcome the gods, ceremonies, carrying offerings on shoulder poles and cultural performances, reinterpreting the spirit of contemporary Hakka identity.



Gongguan Christmas Season

- November-December
- Taipei Water Park

This festival features specially designed floral displays and nighttime illuminations, lighting up the century-old Museum of Drinking Water. Concerts and garden parties enhance the joyful spirit of Christmas.

Nanmen Market

▶ 8, Sec. 1, Roosevelt Rd. ▶ (02) 2321-8069

This market houses well-known, time-honored stores such as Yi Chang Yu Fang, Hoshin Pastry Shop, and King-Long Jerky, offering a wide variety of cooked foods, fresh produce, and groceries. It's also a great place to buy souvenirs.



National Chiang Kai-shek Memorial Hall

▶ 21, Zhongshan S. Rd. ▶ (02) 2343-1100

With its striking blue-tiled roof and white walls, this building is both magnificent and grand. In Democracy Boulevard, visitors can observe the flag-raising and lowering ceremonies and the changing of the guard by the tri-service honor guard. The National Concert Hall and the National Theater flank the square.



Food

Gongguan Shopping District

▶ Roughly encompassing Sec. 4 Roosevelt Rd., Sec. 3 Tingzhou Rd., Sec. 3 Xinsheng S. Rd., and surrounding alleys

Located near National Taiwan University, this district is a shopping and eatery hub. Michelin Bib Gourmand recommended vendors include popular Hsiung Chi Scallion Pancake and Lan Jia Gua Bao, alongside enduring establishments such as Liu Jia Pan-fried Buns.



Nanjichang Night Market

▶ Between Ln. 307 and 315, Sec. 2, Zhonghua Rd.

Food enthusiasts will enjoy this night market's diverse delicacies. It features well-known stalls recommended by the Michelin Bib Gourmand, such as Unnamed Clay Oven Roll, Wu Wang Tsai Chi, and pan-fried buns, tube rice cakes, stinky tofu etc.



Jianzhong Brown Sugar Shaved Ice

▶ 35, Quanzhou St. ▶ (02) 2305-4750

A beloved establishment since 1941, this shop is famous for its brown sugar shaved ice and tapioca jelly. Customers can choose from a wide array of over twenty toppings like taro balls, oatmeal, and peanuts, making it a perfect and customizable summer refreshment.



National Taiwan Museum

In its main building and branches, this century-old museum features exhibits on Taiwan's natural ecology and its cultural history, fossils and ancient life specimens, the early history of Taiwan's camphor and opium trade.



Taipei Botanical Garden

Taiwan's first botanical garden, home to over a thousand plant species, is an important site for plant research and education. The garden has two municipal historic sites — the Guest House of Imperial Envoys Museum and the Herbarium.



National Museum of History

This museum exhibits art objects and artifacts. In its collection are such national treasures as bronze artifacts from the Spring and Autumn period (771-476 BCE). The museum also frequently hosts special exhibitions.



Postal Museum

Focusing on postal knowledge and showcasing stamps from around the world, this museum features models of the first large automatic mail sorting machine, mailboxes, and postal vehicles, making it an excellent place for stamp enthusiasts.



Yuyu Yang Museum

This museum presents a number of retrospective exhibitions dedicated to the well-known sculptor Yuyu Yang's artistic creations, including sculptures and prints. Lectures and cultural events are also held regularly.



Guling Street Avant-garde Theatre

During the Japanese era an official residence and police station, this site retains early detention cells and now serves as a venue that hosts events like exhibitions and performances, attracting art enthusiasts from both Taiwan and abroad.



Tourist Spots

Beimen (North Gate)

▶ At intersection of Zhongxiao W. Rd. and Boai Rd.

Beimen (the North Gate), also known as Chengen Gate, is Taipei's only remaining city gate that retains its original Minnan-style architectural form. The features of Beimen Plaza incorporate the history of the gate and its surroundings, allowing visitors to gain a deeper understanding of Taipei City's historical development.



Presidential Office Building

Completed in 1919 in the Late Renaissance architectural style, this building has been Taiwan's supreme symbol of political power since its inauguration. Parts of the building are open for public tours.



Taipei Guest House

Once the Governor-General's Residence during the Japanese era, this house now functions as a state guesthouse. Its architecture blends Japanese and Baroque elements, showcasing elegant Western-style structures, wooden Japanese halls, and a Japanese-European garden. Visitors should check the official website for opening hours.



Guanghua Digital Plaza & Syntrend Creative Park

▶ Syntrend Creative Park: 2, Sec. 3, Civic Blvd. (02) 7701-0268

Guanghua offers a wide range of electronics, video games, computer products, and various peripherals. The adjacent Syntrend is a modern commercial complex with numerous specialty electronic stores, hosting anime exhibitions and market events regularly.



Taipei Water Park

This park is dedicated to water resource conservation, featuring the Museum of Drinking Water, the Water Metering Room, and the Guanyinshan Reservoir. It also includes water-friendly areas like the Water Country Park.



Culture

National Center of Photography and Images

Constructed in 1937, this building has been transformed into a museum focused on the art of photography and imagery. It houses a valuable collection of photographs, such as early 19th-century portraits and black and white photographs.



Huashan 1914 Creative Park

Once a wine factory, this site has been reimagined as a dynamic cultural and creative park. It now houses creative shops, galleries, and curates arts and music events year-round. The park's extensive lawn is also a beloved spot for relaxation and picnics.



Kishu An Forest of Literature

The former residence of novelist Wang Wen-hsing has been transformed into an event venue with a literary theme, featuring a bookstore, teahouse, and exhibitions. It frequently hosts events, such as lectures, guided tours, and picture book storytelling sessions.



Taipei City Hakka Cultural Park

This park features landscapes representative of Hakka culture. The Hakka Cultural Center details Hakka industries, architecture, festivals, and music, illustrating the lives and geographical shifts of Taipei's Hakka community.



Treasure Hill Artist Village

This cluster of hillside houses, tightly grouped along narrow alleys, has become a dynamic cultural and artistic community. Home to numerous artist studios, it offers a unique blend of art and living spaces.



PIPE Live Music

This place was transformed from a century-old pumping station. It's now a multi-functional performance space. Its large grounds are perfect for indie bands and hip-hop artists, and it regularly features parties, lectures, and showcases.



NOBUO

▶ 8, Taian St.

Drawing on Taiwanese, Japanese, and French influences, the chef of NOBUO creatively combines local seasonal ingredients to craft a menu that adapts with the seasons.



Three Coins Restaurant

▶ 46, Hengyang Rd. ▶ (02) 2381-7180

This long-standing restaurant is famous for its authentic Cantonese cuisine, with crispy fried chicken, roasted duck/goose, and baked seafood in papaya bowl being must-try signature dishes.



Snow King Ice Cream

▶ 2F, 65, Sec. 1, Wuchang St. ▶ (02) 2331-8415

With close to seventy flavors, this time-honored shop offers a wide variety of handmade ice cream. In addition to common choices, they also serve up novel flavors such as pork floss and basil, as well as seasonal-fruit flavors.



Serenity (Zhongzheng)

A perennial Michelin Bib Gourmand selection, this restaurant features a chef adept at using Sichuan techniques to make plant-based dishes. The crispy basil intestines, steamed stinky tofu, and sweet and sour vegetarian chicken cubes are highly recommended.



MoonMoonFood (Qingdao East Road)

▶ 6-2, Qingdao E. Rd. ▶ (02) 3393-8953

Focusing on noodles and soups, this restaurant has consistently received Michelin Bib Gourmand recognition. The peeled chili chicken and the clam and chicken drumstick soup are highly recommended dishes.



Fuhang Soy Milk

▶ 2F, 108, Sec. 1, Zhongxiao E. Rd. (inside Huashan Market) ▶ (02) 2392-2175

Long lines are frequent at this popular traditional breakfast shop. The rich soy milk, with a distinct caramelized aroma, and the sesame flatbread with egg or fried bread stick are a classic and irresistible pairing.
